


On one Monday morning, Leon decided to take his super cool plastic dinosaur toothbrush to school for show and tell.




On his way to school Leon tripped on a rock sending him falling to the ground, but being tough as he is, he got right back up and continued on his way.




But what he didn't realize was that when he tripped, his dinosaur toothbrush fell out of his back pack and into the sewer drain.




The toothbrush flowed down the pipes for miles and miles until it finally reached an opening of clear blue sparkling water.

It wasn't for long that the turtle carried the toothbrush until he bit off the end of it and then dropped it feeling satisfyingly full.




The broken toothbrush slowly fell to the bottom of the ocean startling any fish that got in its way and then sat there for days and days untouched by any creatures.

After a while the crab started feeling sick and decided to give up on the toothbrush and throw it back out to the open water where it would continue its journey.




So Leon's dinosaur toothbrush continued on with its journey.

The Bristles were eaten by tiny critters that lingered on the bottom, and pieces of the handle were shared among all different sorts of creatures that lived in the ocean.




But even after the dinosaur toothbrush was eaten it would still be pooped out and thrown back into the ocean, affecting it for many years to come.





Leon was extra careful in stepping over the rock he tripped on last time, but because he was so focused on the rock, he forgot to zip up his backpack.




Leon's new bamboo toothbrush slowly slipped from his backpack and into the same sewer drain as his dinosaur one did.




The toothbrush flowed down the pipes and into the clear blue water where it came in contact with the same giant sea turtle that ate a part of Leon's other plastic toothbrush.







